## Take a Chance

This fall, the Foundation released a booklet by the Reverend Donald L. Rose titled *Chance, Good Fortune, Divine Providence*. The piece describes the workings of divine providence in our lives and the way that God's hand moves in everything that we describe as "luck." Using passages from Swedenborg to illustrate his points, Rose describes how God does not permit anything that cannot be turned to good. While it may seem sometimes that the evil prosper in the material world, is it really honor and wealth that bring happiness? Or is it the knowledge that through all the ups and downs of life, we are continually being carried upward? "Acknowledging this," says Rose, "brings an inward sense of peace with the confidence that the Lord is 'directing all things and leading to a good end.' ## Swedenborg Now in E-Books

In 2010, the Foundation will begin releasing books in electronic (e-book) format, beginning with the New Century Edition translations of Swedenborg's writings.

E-books contain the full text of the print edition, but have been specially formatted to display in any one of a number of e-book readers such as the Kindle, a device exclusive to Amazon.com. In these e-book readers, the text is laid out as it would be on a book page, with the added capability of changing the text size and appearance. Newer e-book readers also allow the user to bookmark certain pages, highlight and make notes on particular passages, or search the text of a book for key words or phrases.

The first books to be available in e-book format will be *Heaven and Hell*, *Divine Providence*, *Divine Love and Wisdom*, *True Christianity* vol. 1, and *Secrets of Heaven* vol. 1. After that, New Century Edition volumes and new Foundation books will be released in e-book format shortly after the print editions. At press time, it was anticipated that the books would be available on Amazon.com's Kindle reader as well in ePub format, which can be read by the Sony Reader, Barnes and Noble's Nook, the Apple iPhone or iPod Touch, and most other e-book readers. In *Swedenborg, Mesmer, and the Mind/Body Connection: The Roots of Complementary Medicine*, author John S. Haller explores how Emanuel Swedenborg (1688–1772) and Franz Anton Mesmer (1734–1815) influenced the healing practices that became what we think of as complementary or alternative medicine. We talked with him to learn more about their role in the history of medicine.



**LOGOS:** How did you come to identify Swedenborg and Mesmer as pivotal figures in the history of alternative healing?

**JSH:** For the past thirty years or more, I have been studying the alternative and complementary schools of healing that emerged in the United States during the late eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries, writing a number of books on botanical, eclectic, physio-medical, and homeopathic medicine. What I discovered in the process of my research was that a disproportionate number of individuals in each of these medical systems had toyed with the ideas of Anton Mesmer and/or of Emanuel Swedenborg. This led me to ask any number of questions: Who were Mesmer and Swedenborg, and what were the experiences that helped shape their lives and thinking? Who were their American advocates, and in what disciplines or areas of thought did they find the greatest resonance? How did they influence so many different areas of thought and culture?

**LOGOS:** Were the two aware of each other during their lifetimes?

**JSH:** To the best of my knowledge, neither man was aware of the other. At least, they made no mention of each other in their respective writings. Nor can one draw any obvious inferences that such an awareness existed, except for the fact that many of their disciples referenced the other's works and, in some instances, used them as supporting evidence.

**LOGOS:** What did Swedenborg and Mesmer have in common, if anything? How were they different?

**JSH:** Both men were educated in strong Christian belief systems, both men had a fascination with science, and both seemed intent on finding a bridge between Descartes's materialistic view of life and the view that the living organism contained a vital force that came from without the organism.

Notwithstanding their common interest in paranormal experiences that transcended the world of matter, they were more different than similar. Swedenborg was a mystic, a scientist, and a revelator whose writings spanned the physical

The sixteenth edition of the Chrysalis Reader, the Foundation's annual anthology of poetry, essays, and fiction, explores how our perceptions affect what we see. *Kaleidoscope: Lenses on Reality* includes forty entries that each illuminate their own facet of reality.

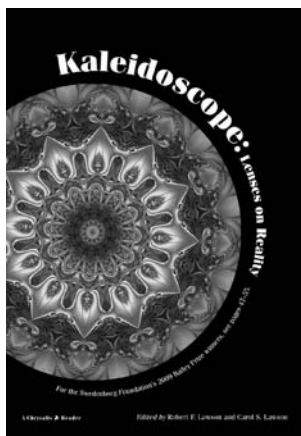
Among the entries are two Bailey Prize winners, one for poetry and one for short fiction. The Bailey Prize was established to encourage young writers to explore the ideas of Emanuel Swedenborg. The contest is open to graduate and undergraduate students, but submissions—which may be short fiction, nonfiction, or poetry—must be made by their professors. The prize was named for Francis Bailey (1744–1817), the first printer to publish Swedenborg's writings in the United States.

The poetry winner is Marissa La Rocca, who wrote the piece during her senior year at the State University of New York Purchase (SUNY). Titled “Family Car Trip,” this short poem takes a sharp turn at the end as parents realize that the unwatched children in the back seat of their car have disappeared. The entry was nominated by Professor Kathleen McCormick of SUNY.

“Old Junk,” a short story by Cheryl Sease of Grand View University in Des Moines, Iowa, won the Bailey Prize for fiction. The story follows a worried son as he struggles to come to grips with signs that his aging father is losing his sanity—only to realize that perhaps his father is the sanest one of all. The story was nominated by Sease's English professor, Dr. Paul Brooke.

Other works chosen for this edition by series editors Carol S. Lawson and Robert F. Lawson include the story of a Native American shepherd struggling to decode a message from his ancestors' spirits; encounters in the Himalayas with holy men and harsh reality; a couple celebrating their second wedding anniversary with their first date; the hazards of achieving enlightenment; and what happens when you don't trust a bank robber.

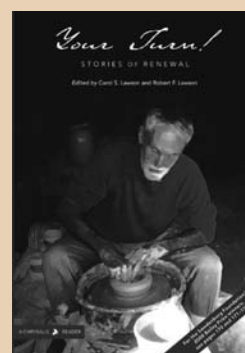

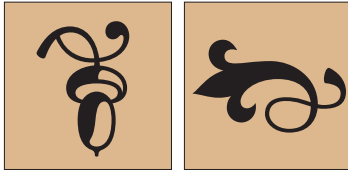

### Foundation Library Catalog Online

The Swedenborg Foundation Library, located at our office in West Chester, Pennsylvania, has recently been electronically cataloged. Visitors can now search our database of books online at our Web site to find out if a specific book is in our collection.

Over two thousand books and documents are available for research needs—from recently published scholarly books, to transcriptions of New Church radio broadcasts, to DVDs and novels featuring Swedenborgian themes, to works on science, history and religion, to biographies and bibliographies. Some of the library's unique documents include historical New Church periodicals such as the *New Church Children's Magazine* and meeting minutes from the 1800s.

Although most of the library's contents can only be used on-site, a number of titles are available for loan. Library operating hours are Monday through Friday, 10:00 a.m.–4:30 p.m.

sciences, theology, and cosmology. His science was directed by a religious enthusiasm bent on discovering the soul. Swedenborg was a critic of the Enlightenment, not because of its accomplishments, but because it ushered in a materialistic view of the universe and a set of standards that excluded such topics as soul, spiritual existence, morality, truth, and aesthetics. His life's work was to transform the greatest scientific gains of the Enlightenment into an illumination and vindication of God's providential laws and purposes.

Mesmer, by contrast, concerned himself little with those who hungered for holiness. Instead, he and his disciples brought remarkable insight into the operations of the mind in a manner and form that was principally secular in tone. He articulated a healing system and a worldview that, while in harmony with nature and reliant upon unseen forces, avoided an explicitly religious explanation for its workings.

**LOGOS:** Why do you think their ideas were so influential in the nineteenth century?

**JSH:** A significant amount of the intellectual discourse in the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries was focused on finding an alternative to Descartes's view of life as automata and to the dysteleology implicit in Darwin's theory of natural selection. Many of the greatest minds of the period felt at ease with both theories but were fearful of the broader implications of a chance universe. Struggling to hold fast to some form of meaning and purpose, they were willing to entertain the possibility of a reality beyond the boundaries of the observed where death was a transition into something other than organic life.

**LOGOS:** Do you think Swedenborg and Mesmer still have something to say to the modern world?

**JSH:** On the borderland of the biomedical paradigm exists a myriad of alternative and complementary healing movements that consider the body/mind connection integral to healing. While spiritualists and New Age healers make obliging references to Swedenborg and Mesmer as precursors, few find comfort in Swedenborg's theology or in the animal magnetism of Mesmer. At best, there is what religion commentator Jean-François Mayer called a "selective interest" that makes the writings of these two men alive among today's healers. Perhaps the ties that continue to bind them have less to do with the specifics of their respective belief systems than they do with the idea that thinking "good health" sets in motion the influx of vital (divine) forces that bring harmony to the body.

## Foundation Attends Scholarly Meetings

Together, the American Academy of Religion (AAR) and the Society of Biblical Literature (SBL) represent two of the largest gatherings of religious scholars in the world. The Foundation attended the AAR meeting in Montreal, Canada, on November 7-10 and the SBL meeting in New Orleans on November 21-24. Having a booth in the exhibition halls of these meetings is an important way to network with scholars who have questions about Swedenborg's theology or want to keep up-to-date on Foundation publications. Each meeting draws about five thousand attendees, with some people going to both.

The AAR meeting is particularly valuable for the Foundation because it attracts scholars from a variety of disciplines, and there are often papers presented on Swedenborgian topics. At the most recent meeting, the Reverend David Fekete of the Church of the Holy City in Edmonton, Canada, discussed parallels in gender imagery between Swedenborg's theology and shakti yoga. But both meetings led to new contacts, new ideas, and new awareness about Swedenborg among the academic community, paving the way for new publishing ventures in the future. ☞

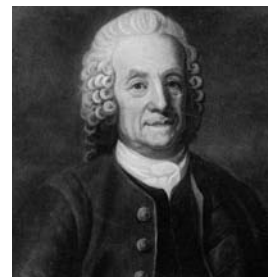

# Gender in Translation of Swedenborg

One of the principles of the New Century Edition is to make the English translation of Swedenborg’s Latin as gender-inclusive as the original. For the most part, this is not too difficult. The simplest solution is usually to use plurals; “they” has no gender, and “we” is often even more satisfactory.

Still, there are times when it is difficult or even impossible to preserve the inclusiveness of the original. The stickiest problems tend to be sentences about individuals whose actions or roles are specified but whose gender is not, such as those that start, “There was a certain spirit who . . .” New Testament parables can pose the same problem. Take the following words of Jesus in Luke 13:18, 19: “What is the kingdom of God like? It is like a mustard seed that a person took and threw into”—into what? “Into his or her garden”? It is hard to imagine Jesus speaking so stiffly. “That people threw into their garden?” Definitely not! “That we threw into our garden”? “That you threw into your garden”? “That one threw into one’s garden”? None of them works.

What is more, I have come to feel that sometimes there is not a good answer to the question of whether Swedenborg is speaking inclusively in a given passage. These are places where he is not so much including or excluding women as not even asking in the first place whether the statement applies to women. Among today’s readers the question can hardly be avoided, but in Swedenborg’s time and culture it could. And where the question is avoided by Swedenborg, it is a distortion to translate either inclusively or noninclusively. What the translator has to decide, then, is whether or not to err on the side of inclusiveness.

One of the places where I had to make that decision while translating *Secrets of Heaven* was in a discussion of the angels and spirits that accompany people on earth. Section 5986 of that work is about “proxy” spirits—spirits delegated by their communities to act more or less as spokespersons for the whole community. While working on it I came upon the following statement: “I have heard spirits saying that a proxy was thinking and saying nothing on his/her own, although s/he fancied s/he was operating completely on his/her own.” Surely, I thought, as I often think, Swedenborg would have said something about gender if any of these were female. Why don’t I just give up and use masculine pronouns?

I proceeded to the next few sections:

The more spirits there are focusing on a single proxy, the stronger the proxy’s power of thinking and speaking. The power increases with the number of compatible spirits focusing on the proxy. This rule was once demonstrated for me by the removal of several influencing spirits, which left the proxy with less power to think and speak. . . .

Some terribly dishonest spirits above my head once selected some proxies and sent them to me in order to subject me to their dirty tricks. They were



greatly disappointed, though. One spirit, on being made a proxy, recoiled, closed up, and curled into a ball in order to cast off the other spirits' influence. That is how this spirit escaped their entanglements.

They then selected another, but this one too they could not force into speaking. The spirit was cleverer than they and evinced the fact by rolling up in a spiral shape, by which they were fooled. (*Secrets of Heaven* 5987, 5989)

Here I received confirmation that it was indeed worthwhile to work at gender inclusion despite the difficulties. As it happens, Swedenborg originally recorded these stories in *Spiritual Experiences* 3909 and 4097–4098, which shed interesting light on the gender of the proxy spirits. The gender of the proxy in the first paragraph of the *Secrets of Heaven* passage is not specified. The spirits targeted as proxies in the next two paragraphs are referred to by masculine pronouns, but that is presumably because the Latin word for a spirit is a masculine noun. (The *grammatical* gender of a pronoun does not need to match the *biological* gender of the being it refers to.) But all three spirits are identified in the parallel *Spiritual Experiences* passages as female. Here are those passages:

I observed a certain female spirit who was the proxy of evil spirits. . . . There were many [other] spirits whose focus and thoughts were on the one who was the proxy, which increased her powers of thought. This was because the more focus there is on one spirit by a large number of spirits, the more powerfully she acts. . . . I told the spirits that their actions were increasing the power of the proxy. As a consequence, they were removed and she was left to the evil spirits alone. She then had no perceptible power. . . .

Some dishonest spirits above my head knew how to acquire proxies for themselves from among some female spirits over my head. . . . Today they took two proxies. One of them, as soon as they started to manipulate her, recoiled and, so to speak, closed up, effectively rejecting [their attempt] immediately and absolutely. Afterward she practically curled into a ball.

There was another who quietly or secretly stayed above my head. . . . The dishonest spirits above my head observed her and acquired her as a proxy, but she went so completely silent that they could not move her at all or speak through her; and she descended a little. The proxy was more dishonest than they. . . . She did not reveal herself there but in another place, forward and to the left, in a long spiral shape. Once the trick was discovered, though, she appeared in her own place, as a long, solid spiral, which showed that she was among the more dishonest. (*Spiritual Experiences* 3903, 4097, 4098)

We can assume that there are other passages that mention female spirits without identifying their gender, passages for which we do not have enlightening parallels. I conclude, then, that no matter how hard it can sometimes be for a translator to find appropriate gender-neutral language, faithfulness to the original requires that she (or he) try. 🌀
